

McKinney Conservation Easement

Director of DPW, Peter Nourse, presented a proposal that would have the city transfer a 3.3 acre parcel to McKinney in order to permanently conserve the lot. McKinney would only ask that he be allowed the use of a small barn on the property.

The conservation of this 10+ acre parcel will protect the watershed for one of the City's water sources.

SELT would handle the transaction. Mr. Nourse stated that three was \$19,429 left in the fund for transactions such as this but he would require an additional \$30,000 in a future CIP.
