

Description of matters discussed, and final decisions made:

City Manager Cox stated that the City is currently in negotiations with AFSCME (Public Works) and the Teamsters (Librarians) regarding new collective bargaining agreements. Cox turned over the discussion to Manager Hoyt.

Manager Hoyt stated that the City had a tentative agreement with AFSCME but the union members had not voted yet. Vote is scheduled for the week of April 22, 2019.

Hoyt stated that the City had a tentative agreement with the Teamsters which was approved by the union. Hoyt then went through the details of the agreement.

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Deputy Mayor Varney asked a question about the cost-sharing for medical plans.

Councilor Walker asked about why the agreement did not include "use it or lose it" provision for vacation/sick days.

All councilors were provided a copy of the draft agreement.

Cox stated that he will present the tentative Teamsters agreement for a vote of the Council at the City Council meeting on May 7, 2019.
