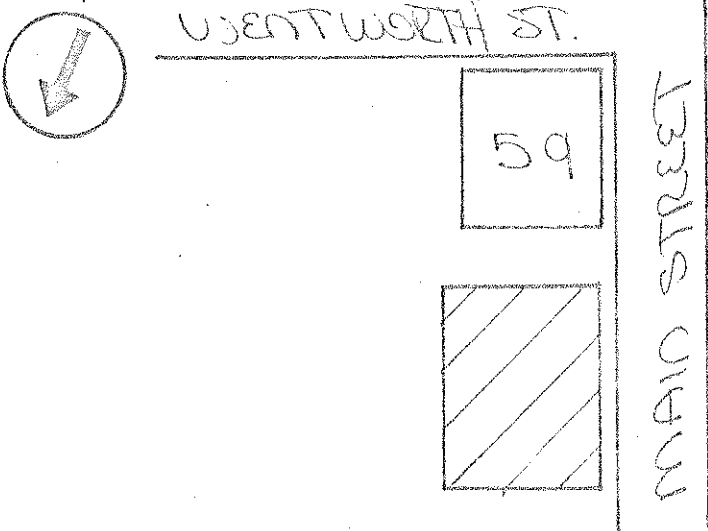

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Indian Head Bank is a contemporary 2 story office building, its facade characterized by expanses of white glazed brick and plate glass windows. A flat roof extends over the offcenter entry.

The south elevation is also open to street view, and features red brick panels alternating with two story window bays.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Evaluation & Historical Associations):

The Indian Head Bank building replaces the Queen Anne style residence of Albert Wallace, an owner of the Wallace Shoe Company. The house was subsequently occupied by the Elks Club before its demolition in 1967
