ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Masonic Hall, a monumental Neo Classic building is distinguished by its heavily-scaled detailing. The facade features paneled sandstone pilasters dividing the upper stories into five bays. The first story, with heavy quoins at each corner serves as a base for the classical ordering of the facade. The pilasters rise from a stone beltcourse above the storefronts, terminating in Scamozzi capitals which support a full entablature with a denticular cornice, and a parapet wall at the roofline. These elements continue along the east elevation except there is a stone pilaster only in the first bay. Simpler brick pilasters set off only rear bay of this wall.

The fenestration is an important element of the symmetrical design, and on the facade a consists of paired 1/1 sash in the three central bays, all topped by stone lintels. In the side bays, single windows have keystones and corner blocks, a motif continued to the first bay of the east elevation.

An inscription stone reading "Masonic Temple" is located at the midpoint of the facade's center bay.

The storefronts remain intact on either side of the building's recessed central entry which features paired doors and a transom. A pressed metal sign architrave spans the storefront level.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:

The Masonic Hall is on the corner of Hanson Street and Central Avenue. It is related in height and proportion to the Farrington Block immediately to the west.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Evaluation & Historical Associations):

The Masonic Hall was dedicated July 4,1911, on property donated by A.C. Hanson. The Masonic have historically occupied the top two stories, renting commercial space at street level. Architecturally it is one of the more elaborate local examples of the Neo-Classical style, and dominates the streetscape on Hanson street.
