ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

A clapboarded, 2 story, 2 bay wide Italianate style commercial block, this building is distinguished by a parapet wall with a projecting cornice \mathfrak{g}^n the roofline supported in paired brackets.

A smaller cornice supported on smaller single brackets suggests the former prescence of a commercial storefront.

The windows contain both 2/2 and 2/1 sash set in plain enframements.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:

The building is appended to the adjacent house (site 34). It is located within a commercial district.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Evaluation & Historical Associations):

A simple example of an Italianate commercial block, it contributes to the visual context of the streetscape.

Designed to coordinate with the commercial character of Hanson Street this structure once had a storefront which housed a barber shop. When its connected structure (site #33, The McGurdy House), was converted for use as an inn this structure was probably built to extend the inn's capacity. Today it is in use as apartments and helps to maintain the historic character of Hanson Street which developed during the day of the railroad.
