## ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

This is a simply detailed Greek Revival style brick tenement exhibiting the typical 5 bay wide,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  story form of mid-nineteenth century double houses. Although the first story windows and entry have been altered, the basic stylistic identity of the building remains intact.

The windows have rectangular granite lintels a very common Greek Revival feature. On both the facade and side elevations the roofline is articulated by a heavy brick architrave which emphasizes the buildings characteristically heavy scale.

Two original interior chimneys project above the south elevation, and the roof retains its appropriate slate shingles.

The house has an original brick ell and a smaller clapboard ell appended C.1880, with a porch displaying Queen Anne style turned posts and similiar spindle screen.

## RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:

Located adjacent to Square, this house begins the residential streetscape looking up Wakefield Street.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Evaluation & Historical Associations):

This structure survives as the only remining example in the district of mid-19th century brick mill worker housing. The five bay,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  story form is typical of this sort of housing throughout New England.
