#1 Scope of Services, Item #5: In the third bulleted item you request that the Vendor shall have "A vehicle identification device ...". Our vehicles have all necessary transport permits and are properly identified by DOT standards, displaying all permit numbers, DOT numbers, our logo and address. That should be fine Are you asking for something beyond these measures? Nothing more than what you have previously described, the NH hazwaste hauler ID number is the most important thing. What are you looking for in the way of a "device"? NH Haz waste hauler ID placard.

#2 a. Scope of Services, Item #9: You have asked that we identify the non-haz items. Are you providing a roll off or dumpster for those products or some other "container"? Can I assume that not only will Rochester provide the container but will handle the disposal and associated costs? Since we are the host community for Waste Management of NH Turnkey Landfill we have long standing agreements with them to provide two roll off containers for things like empty containers, boxes, etc. Plan on two dumpsters to be provided as well as the site of the collection. As a matter of course, we will not be accepting latex paint unless it is dried residual at which time it should be handled as a solid waste. Waste Management will handle and dispose of the solid waste generated from this event on behalf of the City. Likewise expended alkaline batteries are considered solid waste and can be tossed.

Used motor oil is a little dicier. There are residents from nine communities who are allowed to participate. Some communities collect used motor oil, some do not. The City of Rochester <u>does</u> collect used motor oil and Rochester residents, for example, will be directed to our used oil collection center elsewhere in the city. YOU WILL BE EXPECTED TO PROVIDE A MEANS OF COLLECTING AND REMOVING USED MOTOR OIL (AS WELL AS A PRICE) for those residents from towns that do not have a used oil collection program. You will be expected to collect other used petroleum products like gasoline and diesel fuel from residents from all participating communities due to its flammable characteristic.

b. Scope of Services, Item #9: You indicate that Rochester will not pay "for collection of alkaline household batteries, latex paints or used motor oil". Will the City of Rochester be collecting this items themselves and responsible for both collection and disposal? Latex paint is not hazardous. It must be solidified using kitty litter or similar absorbant media and treated as a solid waste. Therefore, it is not necessary to treat it as a hazardous waste. We will require you to take any coatings that are oil or distillate base. (polyeurothanes, alkyd based paints, lacquers, varnishes, etc.) Are you asking that Vendor collect them and dispose/recycle of these items at their own expense? No, we will pay for any and all eligible hazardous wastes. Does Rochester already have a disposal/recycling process in place for these items? Yes for used motor oil from Rochester residents, only.
