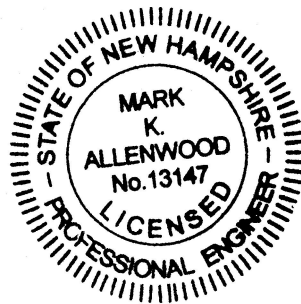

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**SPECIFICATIONS**

**SECTION A-1 ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS**

**DELETE** Heavy Wage Rate, Pages 1 through 3, with date of 8/21/13 in the bottom footer and **REPLACE** with the attached Heavy Wage Rates, Pages 1 through 3, with the date of 10/10/13 in the bottom footer.

Separate sealed BIDS for the construction of the **New Route 125 Wastewater Pump Station Upgrade, Bid No. 14-25**

will be received by **the City of Rochester, City Hall, 31 Wakefield Street, Rochester, NH 03867**

at the office of **Purchasing Agent**

until **2:15 pm**, (Standard Time-Daylight Savings Time) **October 24**, **2013** and then publically opened and read aloud at City Council Chambers at 2:30 pm of the same day.

1. Completion time for the project will be calculated as calendar days from the date specified in the "Notice to Proceed" as follows:

180 calendar days for substantial completion.

210 calendar days for final completion.

Liquidated damages will be in the amount of \$ 1,000 for each calendar day of delay from the date established for substantial completion, and \$ 2,000 for each calendar day of delay from the date established for final completion.

2. Each General Bid shall be accompanied by a Bid Security in the amount of 5% of the Total Bid Price.
3. The successful Bidder must furnish 100% Performance and Payment Bonds, and will be required to execute the Contract Agreement within 10 days following notification of the acceptance of his Bid.

BIDS will be received by **The City of Rochester, New Hampshire**

until **2:15 pm October 24, 2013** at the office of the Purchasing Agent.

Bid will be publically opened and read aloud at City Council Chambers at 2:30 pm of the same day

Each BID must be submitted in a sealed envelope, addressed to:

**Purchasing Agent** at **City Hall, 31 Wakefield Street, Rochester, NH 03867**

Each sealed envelope containing a BID must be plainly marked on the outside as BID

for **New Route 125 Pump Station Upgrade, Bid No. 14-25** and the

envelope should bear on the outside the BIDDER's name, address, and license number if applicable

and the name of the project for which the BID is submitted. If forwarded by mail, the sealed

envelope containing the BID must be enclosed in another envelope addressed to the OWNER at

**City of Rochester, City Hall, Purchasing Agent, 31 Wakefield Street, Rochester, NH 03867.**

All BIDS must be made on the required BID form. All blank spaces for BID prices must be filled in, in ink or typewritten, and the BID form must be fully completed and executed when submitted. Only one copy of the BID form is required.

The OWNER may waive any informalities or minor defects or reject any and all BIDS. Any BID may be withdrawn prior to the above scheduled time for the opening of BIDS or authorized postponement thereof. Any BID received after the time and date specified shall not be considered. No BIDDER may withdraw a BID within 60 days after the actual date of the opening thereof. Should there be reasons why the contract cannot be awarded within the specified period, the time may be extended by mutual agreement between the OWNER and the BIDDER.

BIDDERS must satisfy themselves of the accuracy of the estimated quantities in the BID SCHEDULE by examination of the site and a review of the drawings and specifications including ADDENDA. After BIDS have been submitted, the BIDDER shall not assert that there was a misunderstanding concerning the quantities of WORK or of the nature of the WORK to be done.

The OWNER shall provide to BIDDERS prior to BIDDING, all information which is pertinent to, and delineates and describes, the land owned and rights-of-way acquired or to be acquired.

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WELDERS - Receive rate prescribed for craft performing operation to which welding is incidental.

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Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

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The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical

order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is union or non-union.

#### Union Identifiers

An identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" denotes that the union classification and rate have found to be prevailing for that classification. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2011. The first four letters , PLUM, indicate the international union and the four-digit number, 0198, that follows indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable , i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. The date, 07/01/2011, following these characters is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate/collective bargaining agreement which would be July 1, 2011 in the above example.

Union prevailing wage rates will be updated to reflect any changes in the collective bargaining agreements governing the rates.

0000/9999: weighted union wage rates will be published annually each January.

#### Non-Union Identifiers

Classifications listed under an "SU" identifier were derived from survey data by computing average rates and are not union rates; however, the data used in computing these rates may include both union and non-union data. Example: SULA2004-007 5/13/2010. SU indicates the rates are not union majority rates, LA indicates the State of Louisiana; 2004 is the year of the survey; and 007 is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. A 1993 or later date, 5/13/2010, indicates the classifications and rates under that identifier were issued as a General Wage Determination on that date.

Survey wage rates will remain in effect and will not change until a new survey is conducted.

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#### WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- \* an existing published wage determination
- \* a survey underlying a wage determination
- \* a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- \* a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests

for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
