



Rochester Main Street Program

- Main Street District Downtown Business District
 - \$145 Million Assessed Value
 - ▶ 6% of Entire City
 - \$2.5 Million in property tax revenue
 - > 210 Businesses
 - ▶ 892 FTE Jobs, 361 PTE Jobs
 - 176 Commercial Buildings
 - 24 have vacancies on 1st floor 13.6%
 - ▶ 69% Owner Occupied, 31% Rental
 - 46% of Rental Properties Absentee Landlords
 - 6% Upper Floor Vacancies

Proven Economic Development Program Focused on Downtown Revitalization & Preservation


