

Sarah L. Varney Library Fund

This legacy was left directly to the Rochester Public Library, the income to be used for general book purchases.

February 12, 1940 - the legacy was turned over to the library and deposited in book #44284 in the Rochester Trust Company.

Chapter 51 - Section 24 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, 1942, requires that Trust Funds of the City shall be administered by the trustees of trust funds of the City.

To comply with this requirement the Trustees of the Public Library voted on May 24 - 1943 to transfer this fund to the Trustees of Trust Funds.

Accepted by the City Council July 6, 1943.

Clause from Will of Sarah L. Varney

Twelfth.- I give and bequeath to the Rochester Public Library, Rochester, N. H. the sum of one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars. This gift shall be known as the "Sarah L. Varney Fund" and it is my wish that this amount shall be kept inviolate so far as investment shall permit and the income therefrom to be expended in the purchase of books. It is my wish some designated place shall be set apart for these books and inscribed as follows:
"Purchased from Sarah L. Varney Fund."

Eleventh - I give and bequeath to the Gothic Free Will Baptist Church, Concord, N. H., one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars. This gift shall be known as the "Sarah L. Varney Fund" and it is my wish that this amount shall be kept inviolate so far as investment shall permit and the income therefrom paid over to the general running expenses of said Church.

Twelfth - I give and bequeath to the Rochester Public Library, Rochester, N. H., the sum of one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars. This gift shall be known as the "Sarah L. Varney Fund" and it is my wish that this amount shall be kept inviolate so far as investment shall permit and the income therefrom to be expended in the purchase of books. It is my wish some designated place shall be set apart for these books and inscribed as follows: "Purchased from Sarah L. Varney Fund".

Thirteenth - I give, bequeath and devise my home place and contents at 77 Central Avenue, Rochester, N. H., to Helen L. Lightbody of Rochester, N. H. This gift is given with the following reservations: that my husband, George R. Varney of said Rochester, shall have a life interest in said property during his natural life.

Fourteenth - All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, real, personal or mixed, wherever found or however situated, I give, bequeath and devise to Helen L. Lightbody of Rochester, N. H., to her and her heirs forever.

It is my wish and I do instruct my executor hereinafter appointed by me, to pay all legacies above mentioned in full, that any and all inheritance taxes, if any be levied, shall be paid from the residue of my estate.

I hereby appoint William E. Jacobs of Rochester, N. H. as sole executor of this, my last will and testament and it is my wish that he serve without edging bond, so far as the law will permit, and the Judge of Probate in Strafford County directs.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of December in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

Blackford, of Rochester, one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars.


Sixth - I give and bequeath to the Gaffney Home for the Aged of Rochester, N. H., the sum of five thousand (\$5000.00) dollars. This gift shall be known as the "Sarah L. Varney Fund" and it is my wish that this amount shall be kept inviolate so far as investment shall permit and the income therefrom paid over to the general running expenses of said home.

Seventh - I give and bequeath to the City of Rochester, N. H., the sum of five thousand (\$5000.00) dollars to be held by them in trust, said fund to be known as the "Sarah L. Varney Fund" and it is my wish that this amount shall be kept inviolate so far as investment shall permit and the income therefrom paid over to the general running expenses of said church, subject to be used at their discretion.

Eighth - I give and bequeath to the True Memorial Church of Rochester, N. H. the sum of five thousand (\$5000.00) dollars. This gift shall be known as the "Sarah L. Varney Fund" and it is my wish that this amount shall be kept inviolate so far as investment shall permit and the income therefrom paid over to the general running expenses of said church.

Ninth - I give and bequeath to the Ladies Aid Society of the True Memorial Church, of Rochester, N. H. the sum of one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars. This gift shall be known as the "Sarah L. Varney Fund" and it is my wish that this amount shall be kept inviolate so far as investment shall permit and the income therefrom paid over to the general running expenses of said church.

Tenth - I give and bequeath to the Ladies Aid Society of the True Memorial Church, of Rochester, N. H. the sum of one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars. This gift shall be known as the "Sarah L. Varney Fund" and it is my wish that this amount shall be kept inviolate so far as investment shall permit and the income therefrom paid over to the general running expenses of said church.
