This fund was paid directly to the Rochester Public Library in 1900 and deposited on book \$6067 in the Rochester Loan and Banking Company

Chapter 51 - Section 24 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, 1942, requires that Trank Funds of the City shall be administered by the trustees of trust funds of the City.

To comply with this requirement the Trustees of the Public Library voted on May 24 - 1963 to transfer this fund to the Trustees of Trust Funds.

This legacy was accepted by the City Council July 6 - 1943. See Council Reserves of that date.

Farrington Library annex.

This will was probated on July 20, 1895. There was no accounting, however the total estate was only a little over \$3.000.00.
