City of Rochester notifying the City of appointment
as trustee under the will of Ephraim O. Hammett,
also the following copy of the tenth clause of
Hammett's will.

Tenth: I give and bequeath to my said trustee the sum of two hundred dollars in trust to be by him held and invested and the income thereof as may be necessary to be expended upon my burial lot and monument situate in Rochester Cemetery, to keep it in good condition and improve and beautify the same. I also give and bequeath to my said trusted the sum of Twenty five dollars in trust to be held and invested by him, the income thereof to be expended in the care and improvement of the lot occupied by John Clark, Susan Clark, Dorothy Jenness, Abigail Clark and his wife, also situated in said Rochester Cemetery and I also give and bequeath to my said trustee the sum of Twenty five dollars in trust from which he is to erect a headstone over the grave of Elizabeth Doe, my sister, and the balance to be invested and the income to be expended in the care and improvement of the burial lot in which my said sister. Elizabeth Doe and Samuel Doe are buried in East Rochester Cemetery

in said Rochester, and I also give and bequeath to my said trustee the sum of Fifty Dollars in trust to be by him invested and the income therefrom expended in the care and improvement of the lot in which my father, Ephraim Hammett is buried on Rochester Hill (so-called) in said Rochester. Should any of the income of the sums bequeathed for the care and improvement of cemetery lets not be needed for annual expenditure them such income may accumulate until needed, but to be finally expended on said lots.

On motion of Councilman Davis voted that the trust funds be accepted."

Income from this fund is to be used for perpetual care of the Hammett Lot in the Old Cemetery.
