To the Mayor and City Council of the City of
Rochester:

The Committee to whom was referred a fund of two hundred dollars offered the City of Rochester by John E. Moore, and to be known as the John E. Moore Fund, the interest of which to be expended annually for the care of his burial lot and James L. Allen's in Gonic Cemetery and the balance of said income to be used for the care of graves of soldiers who served in the war of the rebellion in 1861, and are buried in said cemetery, recommend that the City accept the Fund in accordance with the wishes of John E. Moore.

Voted that the report be accepted and its recommendations adopted.

Council Meeting April 7, 1914

The following resolution was introduced by Councilman Small & passed under suspension of the rules.

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Rochester. That the accumulations from the trust fund left by the will of Mr. John Moore to the City of Rochester as Trustee, the income of which is to be expended in the Cemetery at Conic Village, be paid to the Conic Cemetery Association to be expended under their direction.
