## RESOLUTION ACCEPTING FUNDS FOR THE ROLAND & LORRAINE ROBERGE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCHESTER:

WHEREAS, the family of the late Mayor Roland Roberge and first lady, Lorraine Roberge, have indicated a desire to establish a scholarship fund to be known as the "Roland & Lorraine Roberge Scholarship Fund"; and

WHEREAS, the family of the late Roland and Lorraine Roberge wish such scholarship fund to be held and administered by the City of Rochester as a Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, the family of the late Roland and Lorraine Roberge have turned over to the Trustees of the Trust Fund of the City of Rochester the sum of \$14,366.26, which sum represents the initial principal amount of said trust, the same having been accumulated as the result of the generosity of the family and friends of the late Roland and Lorraine Roberge; and

WHEREAS, the family of the late Roland and Lorraine Roberge have indicated their desire that the operation, purpose and intent of the Roland and Lorraine Roberge Scholarship Fund be as follows:

- 1. The income from the Scholarship Fund shall be awarded annually to the form one male and one female graduate of Spaulding High School; any remaining times will be tunsferred to Principal
- Each recipient must have maintained a 3.00 grade point average in Math and Science and have taken college preparatory or higher level courses while a student at Spaulding High School;
- 3. Each recipient must be accepted for post secondary study at an accredited vocational school or four year college; and
- 4. Each scholarship shall be awarded based on financial need; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of R.S.A. 31:22, all trust funds, once accepted by the municipality, are to be administered by the Trustees of the Trust Fund;
